


STUDENT ARTWORK

One mum's roadmap through the early challenges of Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder.

ADHD--Not Just Naughty is an uplifting guide for parents and care-givers of children diagnosed with Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder. (ADHD) The main symptoms are hyperactivity, impulsivity and inattention.

Problem issues may include lack of focus, unfinished tasks, constantly interrupting, difficulty sitting still, trouble waiting their turn, and fidgeting. Children are often unfairly labelled as 'just naughty'.

This book offers practical parenting strategies, intertwined with real-life incidents, with a dash of humour thrown in. Issues such as self-esteem, social skills, schooling, discipline and controlling anger are explored, with a strong focus on emotional well-being of both parent and child.

It also comes with a message of hope, that children with ADHD are not *just naughty* and that diagnosis of ADHD can be a new beginning to a better relationship.
